First Steps Nursery

The first steps a child takes in the process of learning are very important and our First Steps Centre sets out to support and guide our young pupils to begin that journey of learning through exploration, investigation and communication.

The First Steps Centre is based in a bright and stimulating classroom with access to a playground area and a designated playroom.

Key Stage 1 & 2

Pupils in Arvalee's Primary Centre are taught the Revised Northern Ireland Curriculum through thematic approaches, incorporating thinking skills and personal capabilities and all our pupils are encouraged to be active learners.

We pride ourselves in having developed a variety of teaching strategies to deliver the curriculum to pupils who experience challenges to learning and in providing individualised learning pathways.

The primary curriculum is divided into six areas of learning:

- Language Development and Literacy
- Mathematics and Numeracy
- The World Around Us
- Personal Development and Mutual Understanding
- Physical Development
- The Arts





The Secondary School

The curriculum is differentiated for each pupil in the school and delivered in an age-appropriate and relevant manner.

At Arvalee School we are keen to support our pupils in making the transition from Primary to Secondary School. This can be from our own Primary School or from other Primary Schools in our catchment area and we have an induction programme aimed at helping pupils to settle well into their new surroundings. staff, pupils

Key Stage 3

Pupils in KS3 are taught the Revised Northern Ireland Curriculum which is a busy and interesting one. Some pupils are also involved in swimming, horse riding and are members of our junior football team.

Key Stage 4

Pupils in KS4 follow a two year programme from a core curriculum with choices from Occupational GCSEs leading to qualifications at Entry Level and Level 1 and 2. Each pupil will select 4 units over the two years from the Occupational Areas.

Post 16

In Post 16 we encourage our pupils to further develop the skills and attributes that they need for life after school. Pupils follow a core curriculum which is aimed at further developing skills in Communication, Using Mathematics, Using ICT and Thinking Skills and Personal Capabilities.

Pupils in Post 16 attend South West College - Omagh Campus for 2 days and are involved in work experience for another day. This programme is designed to support our pupils in developing their independency and it is excellent preparation for life and work. At South West College pupils have the opportunity

to broaden their experiences in Occupational areas choosing from a wide range - Beauty, Vehicle Studies and Painting
